Classwork: Classwork is based on the specific IEP goals that have been developed for each student.

Quizzes and Test: Quizzes and test will be given periodically both announced and unannounced. Quizzes and test will typically be provided individually to each student and are designed based on the student's IEP goals.

IEP: The parent of each student has received a copy of the student's IEP and each student has received a copy of this on their Google Meets page, which outlines their classroom accommodations, academic and functional strengths, present levels of performance, and IEP goals.

IEP Meetings: If a student or a parent wishes to have a special review IEP meeting they should notify Mr. Livingston verbally, through email, or by telephone call.

Supplies: The students do not need any special supplies for the class.

#### **Classroom Expectations:**

- 1. We will work as hard as we can on all activities.
- 2. We will respect others when they are speaking or expressing their opinion.
- 3. We will have the materials we need each day for school.
- 4. We will report to our assigned areas at the posted times.
- 5. We will follow directions when given.
- 6. We will work each day to make ourselves a better person than we were yesterday.

## Discipline Procedures:

- 1. Individual conference with student.
- 2. Student reflection activity
- 3. Teacher/Student telephone call to the parent
  - a. If contact is not made on the telephone call, Mr. Livingston will make a home visit
- 4. Parent/Student/Teacher conference at the school
- 5. If there is a pattern in the behavior steps will begin to develop a behavior intervention plan for the student.
- 6. All discipline issues will be addressed according to the guidelines as outlined by district and school policies.
